The Beatles

The Beatles were the most popular band of the 1960s; even bigger than Elvis. The Beatles was made up of four men from Liverpool, England: John Lennon (1940 - 1980, was assassinated, main singer and guitar player of the band), Paul McCartney (1942- present, secondary singer and bass player), George Harrison (1943 - 2001, died of cancer, secondary guitar player), and Ringo Starr (1940 – present, drummer). Together, they made some of the greatest albums ever recorded such as *The White Album*, *A Hard Day’s Night*, *Rubber Soul*, and *Sergeant Pepper’s Lonely Hearts Club Band*. One of The Beatles’ most popular songs, “Yesterday”, sung by Paul, is the most recorded song of all time with about 3,000 other artists recording their own version. Then suddenly, in 1970, after the recording of their latest albums *Let it Be* and *Abbey Road*, the Beatles broke up. They also made movie versions of some of their albums. But Now this year, everything ever recorded by the Beatles is being sold on iTunes for only \$150! So, if you’re looking for an interesting band, listen to the Beatles!

Did you know there are about 39 million Hispanics living in the USA?

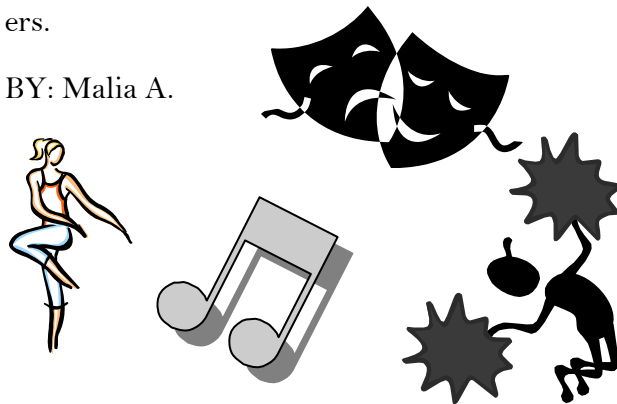

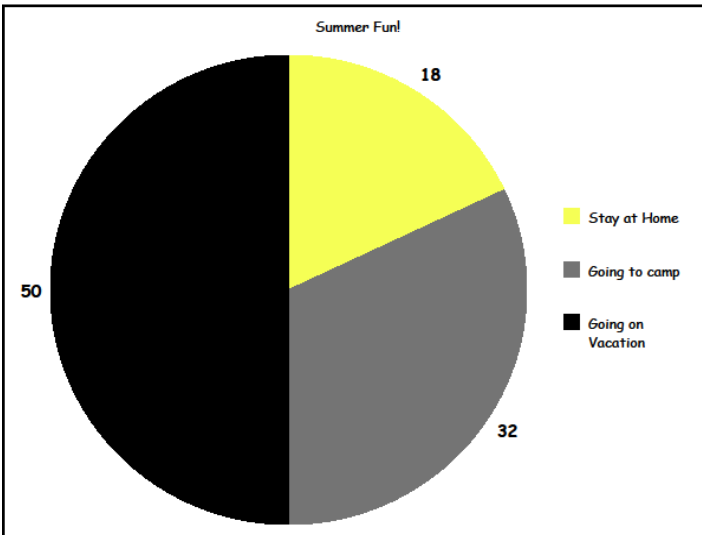
Cartridges For Kids (CFK)
